


NOVEMBER 2023 - CALLS BY DAY & TIME






The administrative division of the police department consists of the Chief of Police, Captain, and Administrative Assistant.




DECEMBER 2023 - CALLS BY DAY & TIME





DECEMBER 2023 - ADMINISTRATIVE




The administrative division of the police department consists of the Chief of Police, Captain, and Administrative Assistant.




DECEMBER 2023 - ACCOUNTABILITY

There were five use of force incident during the month of November.


All use of force incidents involved an officer pointing their duty issued firearm. The five reported use of force incidents span two different situations.

The first incident involved a search warrant on a residence during a investigation. The suspect in that investigation was hiding in the residence, and two officers pointed their firearm at the subject after locating, and while giving commands to take them into custody.

The second incident involved a weapons complaint/ disturbance in which a suspect was armed and pointed their firearm at another person. Officer ultimately located the subject and performed a high-risk traffic stop - three HLPD officers directed their firearms at the subject while taking them into custody.

Both of these events were reviewed per our policy and procedure and found that the officers were justified and within policy and procedure.

SUBJECT: POLLING LOCATION CHANGE FOR WARDS 8-11

DATE: JANUARY 10, 2024

<u>Discussion:</u> With the completion of Fire Station I, staff would like to begin using this facility as the polling location for Wards 8-11 for the August 13, 2024 Fall Primary Election.

Although polling places shall be established for each election at least 30 days before the election (Wis. Stat. 5.25(3)), we would like to start the process of moving the location now. This timeline would give staff the amount of time needed to inform the public of this change, for the voters to adjust to a new polling location prior to the 2024 Presidential Election, and to properly notify St. Joseph's Church.

Currently, we lease space from the Church as the polling location for Wards 8-11 and per our lease agreement with them must give 180 days notice to terminate. To meet the termination terms of our agreement, notice should be given to the Church on or before February 1, 2024.

<u>Potential Motion:</u> To direct staff to properly notify St. Joseph's Church on or before February 1, 2024 of our intent to terminate our lease on August 1, 2024.

BACKGROUND



The Village Board, with a recommendation from the Public Works and Utilities Advisory Commission, has decided to not lower the speed limit on Shady Drive, but did direct the staff to develop a plan for speed abatement for consideration. After several discussions and meetings, we are proposing the following for the Board to act upon.

PROPOSAL

SIGN PLACEMENT

The Village will place two (2) "Children at Play" signs, one on the western end of Shady Drive (near the intersection with County Line Road), the other on the eastern end (near the intersection with North Overland Road). The projected costs for the sign placement are:

- \$69.00 Purchase of the two signs
- \$34.00 Purchase of two posts to place the signs (if needed)
- \$134.32 Labor installation and equipment needed
- \$237.32 Total

The cost of this phase of the project would be funded out of the General Fund.

SPEED BOARD PLACEMENT

The second part of the project would be the placement of a speed sign at a point on Shady Drive to be determined by the Hobart-Lawrence Police Department (HLPD). This speed sign would NOT be permanently affixed – and will be relocated throughout the Village on asneeded basis as determined by the HLPD.

Due to the use across the Village, we are recommending this phase of the project be funded with ARPA funds (\$5,643). The quote has been attached to this report.

BACKGROUND

There is currently \$2,000.00 allotted in the 2024 budget for animal services for the Village. This is the same amount that was in the past 2023 budget.

Recently, we have had a number of calls requesting officers pick up cats and transport them to Packerland or to have officers respond to Packerland to sign in cats that were brought by citizens. The current contract with Packerland requires an officer to sign the cat in for Packerland to be able to bill the village for the cost of the cat. In reviewing our contract with Packerland, in 2024 the cost per cat brought to their facility is \$ 185. This roughly allows for (10) cats per fiscal year before exhausting the budget for 2024. This does not include the costs involving staff time for officers, miles and gas for village vehicles, etc.

In summary, many of the recent calls have centered around residents who are choosing to trap cats for a variety of reasons. Most did not involve the cat being involved in nuisance activities, i.e. damaging property, creating a dangerous situation on the property for animals or residents, having a significant injury (medical treatment needed), etc. In one instance, the resident is concerned about the cats in the cooler temperatures and is trapping them to take them to Packerland. In another instance, a resident wanted us to try to trap a rabbit that is around her property due to her concern her dog may kill the rabbit. In yet another instance, a resident put out a trap to try to catch their pet (cat) who is lost. The resident instead has trapped other cats, however, has been unable to catch their own. There are also other similar incidents in the past several months.

Wisconsin State Statute 173.13 states:

173.13 Taking custody of animals.

(1) INTAKE.

- (a) A humane officer, on behalf of a political subdivision in which the humane officer has jurisdiction under s. 173.03 (3), or a law enforcement officer, on behalf of a political subdivision, may take custody of an animal if the humane officer or law enforcement officer has reasonable grounds to believe that the animal is one of the following:
 - 1. An abandoned or stray animal.
 - **2.** An unwanted animal delivered to the humane officer or law enforcement officer.
 - 3. A dog not tagged as required by ch. 174.
 - **4.** An animal not licensed in compliance with any ordinance.
 - **5.** An animal not confined as required by a quarantine order under any statute, rule or ordinance relating to the control of any animal disease.

- **6.** An animal that has caused damage to persons or property.
- **8.** An animal used in any crime under s. <u>944.18</u> or ch. <u>951</u> or that constitutes evidence of a crime under s. <u>944.18</u> or ch. <u>951</u>.
- 9. An animal delivered by a veterinarian under sub. (2).
- **(b)** A humane officer shall accept into custody any animal delivered by a law enforcement officer or delivered under a court order.

Subsection (1)(a) specifically states "may" take custody of an animal if they have reasonable grounds to believe any of the situations listed have occurred.

PROPOSAL

We would like to propose three different actions to the board for their consideration:

- 1) If the board wants to continue to provide the current services for cats to village residents, we are requesting the board provide policy direction as to which animals or cats should be taken to Packerland by officers. The following is the suggested language for consideration:
 - "A stray cat or other animal will only be accepted by the Village if any of the following conditions are met:
 - a) The animal is an articulable threat to the property of a resident, as evidenced by visible damage that has been caused.
 - b) The animal is an articulable threat to the person or pet, as evidenced by visible injury that has been caused.
 - c) The animal appears to be suffering from a significant injury or illness (i.e. hit by a car, etc.), where the only humane option would be to provide care. This is at the sole discretion of the police department when they respond to said call for service."
- 2) The Village of Hobart looks into options surrounding housing of stray cats (and costs incurred) for delivery to the TNR (Trap, Neuter, Release) Program in Brown County. If the potential feasibility exists, staff will bring back the details to the Village Board for their consideration. For additional information on the TNR program, see the following: https://catsanonymous.org/
- 3) As there is no statutory requirement for municipalities to provide services for any animals other than dogs, moving forward the Village of Hobart will not be taking or transporting any cats. *

If the board were to act reference the third proposal, it is recommended that a contract still be in place with Packerland for any dogs, animals seized by the police in conjunction with a crime or criminal investigation, animals seized via order of a court, animal seized as dangerous or needing quarantine due to monitoring for rabies, or any other like instance as needed as established by the Police Department or Village Administrator. (This would likely require the current Packerland contract to be slightly modified. The police department can assist the Village Administrator in this process if so directed by the board).

November 21, 2023 - Introduced by Senators Testin, James, Quinn, Stafsholt and Wanggaard, cosponsored by Representatives Hurd, Krug, Macco, Mursau, O'Connor, Petryk, Schmidt and Wittke. Referred to Committee on Transportation and Local Government.

1	AN ACT to amend 62.23 (7a) (a) and 236.02 (5); and to create 60.10 (1) (h)
2	66.0217 (14) (c) and 66.0813 (7) of the statutes; relating to: water and
3	sewerage system connections and annexation of territory and extraterritorial
4	zoning in certain towns.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill allows certain towns to designate themselves as "urban towns," a designation that would limit the effect of extraterritorial zoning and plat approval and annexation by other municipalities. The bill also requires local governments to allow connection, with certain limited exceptions, to their water or sewerage systems by certain other local governments.

Under the bill, a town that meets all of the following may designate itself as an "urban town" upon approval by the town meeting:

- 1. The town has a population of more than 5,000 and a population density of 750 persons in any one square mile.
 - 2. The town provides law enforcement service.
 - 3. The town has enacted a subdivision ordinance.
 - 4. The town has enacted a zoning ordinance or is subject to county zoning.

Under the bill, a town that has been designated as an urban town is not subject to extraterritorial zoning or extraterritorial plat approval by a neighboring city or village. Also under the bill, certain significantly developed territory of an urban town may not be annexed to a city or village except by unanimous approval of all of the property owners of the property to be annexed. The territory covered by this

limitation is territory in the urban town that is within three miles of the corporate limits of a first, second, or third class city, or one and one-half miles of a fourth class city or a village if 1) the territory has an average of more than 30 housing units per quarter section or 2) the territory has an assessed value, more than 25 percent of which is attributable to existing or potential mercantile, manufacturing, or public utility uses.

The bill also requires certain governmental units (cities, villages, and sanitary or utility districts located in cities and villages) to allow connection with limited exceptions to their sewer or water systems by urban towns (urban towns and sanitary or utility districts located in urban towns), and vice versa. Specifically, under the bill, an urban town may request the extension or connection of water or sewer service from an adjacent governmental unit by filing a written request for connection. The governmental unit may disapprove a request only if its water or sewerage system does not have sufficient capacity to serve the area that is the subject of the request as of the date of the filing. Likewise, a governmental unit may request an extension or connection to the sewer or water system of an urban town and the request must be approved unless the system does not have sufficient capacity to serve the area covered by the request. The bill also provides that a landowner may request a lateral connection to the water or sewerage system of a governmental unit or urban town. A request of this sort may also be denied only upon a determination of insufficient capacity.

For further information see the local fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

 - 3. The town has enacted a subdivision ordinance under s. 236.45 (2) (ac).

SECTION 2. 62.23 (7a) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

62.23 (7a) (a) Extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction means the unincorporated area, other than qualified urban town territory, as defined in s. 66.0217 (14) (c) 1., within 3 miles of the corporate limits of a first, second or third class city, or 1 1/2 miles of a fourth class city or a village. The unincorporated area subject to extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction includes areas that are either surrounding or entirely surrounded by a single city or village. Wherever extraterritorial zoning jurisdictions overlap, the provisions of s. 66.0105 shall apply and any subsequent alteration of the corporate limits of the city by annexation, detachment or consolidation proceedings shall not affect the dividing line as initially determined under s. 66.0105. The governing body of the city shall specify by resolution the description of the area to be zoned within its extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction sufficiently accurate to determine its location and such area shall be contiguous to the city. The boundary line of such area shall follow government lot or survey section or fractional section lines or public roads, but need not extend to the limits of the extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction. Within 15 days of the adoption of the resolution the governing body shall declare its intention to prepare a comprehensive zoning ordinance for all or part of its extraterritorial zoning jurisdiction by the publication of the resolution in a newspaper having general circulation in the area proposed to be zoned, as a class 1 notice, under ch. 985. The city clerk shall mail a certified copy of the resolution and a scale map reasonably showing the boundaries of the extraterritorial jurisdiction to the clerk of the county in which the extraterritorial jurisdiction area is located and to the town clerk of each town, any part of which is included in such area.

- 6. The cost of construction and connection of the water or sewerage system of a governmental unit to an urban town's water or sewerage system pursuant to an approval under subd. 2. or 3. is the responsibility of the governmental unit.

- Upon connection pursuant to an approval under subd. 2. or 3., the governmental unit or urban town may charge the landowner a fee that bears a
